As of December 2012, our network has a membership of about 50 scientists, from diverse academic organizations (Singapore Institution of Clinical Science/SICS, Genome Institute of Singapore/GIS, Institute of Microelectronics/IME, National University of Singapore/NUS, etc.) as well as industry (Roche Translational Medicine Hub, Maccine Pte Ltd, MSD).
